

Womanist & African-centered Psychology: Psychological Assessment & Trauma Recovery Program

The Opportunity

AHP's 2025-2026 Postdoctoral Fellow will join a close-knit team of mental health professionals committed to the work of healing BIPOC communities and their non-BIPOC allies. This includes conducting psychological assessments as you are nurtured through the process as a healer-intraining. The opportunity is to join a hardworking, yet supportive team focused on social justice through psychological wellbeing. Our program provides advanced clinical training opportunities in assessment based in Georgia (Atlanta). Clinical cases primarily involve individuals who present with a variety of psychiatric illnesses, accompanying cognitive symptoms, and/or comorbid medical illnesses (e.g., PTSD, ADHD, learning disorders, mood disorders, pain disorders, traumatic brain injury, substance abuse, and dementias). Populations served range in age from early childhood to geriatric.

Candidates must have a commitment to growing in the areas of Womanist theory, indigenous healing practices, and African-centered Psychology with a focus on decolonial praxis. This pivotal moment in history provides an opportunity for motivated healers-in-training to help our clients and the larger community deal with the psychological stressors facing us all. This is a dynamic opportunity for innovative thought-leaders, inspired towards action that will foster global healing and change. This position emphasizes development of clinical skills working in the areas of trauma assessment, decolonial praxis, and support for BIPOC individuals, families and communities. Fellows will receive extensive training in assessment, supervision, consultation, and community outreach. While the focus of this opportunity is assessment based, there is the opportunity to see a small number of therapy clients.

Healer-in-Training Profile

Our Postdoctoral Fellow will display exceptional interpersonal, client and self-care skills. This individual will have a demonstrated commitment to the work at a grass roots level and is seeking a supportive environment to continue towards licensure as a psychologist. The successful candidate has the ability to work some evenings, can balance multiple tasks, possesses exceptional organizational skills, and is a self-starter. The healer-in-training is well-spoken, punctual, goal-oriented, and reliable.

Successful applicants will have completed an APA-accredited doctoral program in psychology and an APA-approved internship. Candidates must have significant prior assessment experience and superior writing skills. Experience working with clients of culturally, economically, and religiously diverse backgrounds, as evidenced by prior training is a must. Significant interest in training based in culturally responsive, African-centered, Womanist, or Decolonial interventions is a must.

Duties & Responsibilities

Conduct initial intake assessments and provide referrals when appropriate.

Sankofa: The Akan speaking peoples in Ghana define Sankofa as going back and retrieving that which was lost. We believe in the process of rediscovering and safeguarding personal, family, and community cultural history and psychological wellbeing.

Ancestral Connection: We believe in the wisdom of healthy elders, the ancestors, and those who have walked the path before us.

Spirituality: We uplift the importance of connection to divine source as it manifests within individuals, families, and communities.

Ìwà pèlè (**Good Character**): We believe the proverb: Character is like smoke; it cannot be hidden for long. Thus, we are honest and take responsibility for our actions.

Social Justice: We acknowledge the existence of and resist institutionalized racism, gender, disability, sexual identity, and economic inequality, privilege, and microaggressions.

Courage: We will be courageous even when the alternative is financially advantageous.

Collaboration: We partner with those who are psychologically healthy, believe in justice, engage in personal healing, and work towards the liberation of BIPOC globally.

Compensation: This post-doc position offers a salary of \$46,000. Additional benefits include access to healthcare, dental and vision coverage. Our office is designated as a National Health Service Corps site enabling clinicians to apply for student loan repayment after becoming fully licensed as a psychologist.
